2023 LYON COUNTY FAIR OPEN CLASS GENERAL INFORMATION

MEALS: Many vendors are on the grounds for all your dining needs.

GATES: Open between 7 am and midnight daily. Only authorized persons allowed on grounds between midnight and 7 am.

PETS: No dogs or pets, other than handicapped assistance animals shall be permitted on the Fair site or any buildings or tents during the Fair, unless they are part of an authorized act, exhibit, or competition.

EXHIBIT & COMMERCIAL BUILDINGS will be open at 11:00 am; Open Class Building also opens at 11:00 am. No exhibit including 4-H can be released before 4:00 pm the final day of the county fair. Early removal will result in loss of premium money. All animals & pets exhibited at the fair must follow State Dept. of Animal Health Rules.

RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. The Lyon County Agricultural Society management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the Fair.
- 2. The management reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as it in its judgment may deem advisable.
- 3. All concession people and exhibitors should have their supplies on the grounds by 5:00pm Wed.; 11:00am Thurs.-Sun.

ENTRY INFORMATION

Open Class: See daily hours buildings open

No exhibits will be accepted after 10am into judging. Exhibits may be left to be displayed ONLY. **Exhibits brought after 10:00 AM will not be judged.**

Exhibitor Fees: \$2.00 if postmarked by Wednesday, August 2, 2023 or registered online by Sunday, August 6 by 8:00 PM. \$5.00 if postmarked after Aug. 3 or on Entry Day.

Premiums: 1st - \$2.00; 2nd - \$1.50; 3rd - \$1.00 *unless otherwise indicated

Online entries: \$2.00. Payable at the fair.

Deadline to online register is 8 pm on Aug. 6, 2023.

1. Entries are open to persons living in Lyon County and all outside areas.

- 2. Only one entry may be made in one lot by one exhibitor and from one plot or farm.
- 3. Shortage in measure or count will disqualify a sample from competing.
- 4. Entry blanks will be furnished to each person making entries and such blanks must be filled out in the language of the premium book as to Department, Division, and Class.
- 5. Every article for competition must correspond in number and description with the premium list and be in the proper division in order to obtain premiums.
- 6. No animal or article unworthy of a premium shall receive one, even though there may be no competition. Where there is no competition in the class, the animal or article will not receive premium higher than its merit deserves.
- 7. The Executive Committee will take every precaution in its power for the preservation of articles and stock on exhibit, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur either during their delivery upon the grounds, their exhibition or their removal.
- 8. No change or alterations will be permitted after the books are placed in the hands of the judges; and all persons entering animals must be sure the stock is placed in the appropriate class, or it is the duty of the judges to rule out any animal not answering to the entry.
- 9. Members of the awarding committee shall not consult with others on the merits of the animals or articles they are judging.
- 10. Any person attempting to interfere with the awarding committee during the adjudication shall forfeit the premium he or she might otherwise be entitled to in that division.
- 11. Nothing shall be entered as special if it is not listed in the premium book.
- 12. Premiums will be awarded unless the article does not come to the judge's standard.
- 13. When there is nothing in a class deserving a premium the judge or committee shall make no award. Lack of competition shall not be the cause of withholding a premium, if the animal or article be worthy, except, where otherwise provided. The regular premium offered by the Society cannot be changed except by consent of the parties interested. Championship will not be awarded unless there is competition.
- 14. Judges or committees (especially those on animals) shall give reason for their decisions embracing the value or desirable qualities of the animals or articles to which premiums are awarded.

15. No advertising matter will be allowed to be placed on any article, or on any walls of any of the stalls or places where articles are placed for exhibit and competing for premiums, until after the judging

has been done and awards placed.

17. All entries in Department A - Horses. See division for rules.

18. All animals and articles entered are to remain in place on the grounds until 4:00 pm, the last day of

the fair.

19. The date for computing the ages of horses entered shall be January 1.

20. The Fair Board will not supply hay or bedding.

21. No person should be allowed to distribute any advertising matter on the grounds except from their

place of business of exhibit. Tacking or posting bills is prohibited.

22. Should circumstances beyond the control of the Society prevent the usual attendance and thus

diminish funds as to fall short of funds to pay premiums in full, they will be paid prorated.

23. All vouchers for premiums awarded will be mailed to the exhibitors receiving the award as soon after the close of the Fair as the fair office can complete the premium awards. These vouchers will be

drawn on the Treasurer and can be cashed at any bank within 90 days after issuance or they will be

void.

Registration: All 4-H exhibits need a completed Fair Registration Form submitted to the Extension Office by July 1st.

Only registered items will receive premiums.

EXHIBITION OF LIVESTOCK IN MINNESOTA

Summary of State Rules Exhibitions

This year's fair vet:

- * If your animal needs treatment, you are responsible for payment.
- * All horses will be examined on day of entry by the Official Veterinarian.
- * Veterinarian requires a copy of Coggins papers be turned in. State laws say that any horse at a public exhibition must be tested within the last 12 months.
- * No premium will be awarded to any improperly recorded division or horse.
- * We are not responsible for injuries of your horse.

TIPS ON HOW TO DISPLAY VEGETABLES

Harvesting Tips

Try to harvest root crops when the soil is relatively dry. They should not be woody or overgrown. Tops should be trimmed to 2 inches above the crown. Long tops draw moisture from the roots and cause shriveling. Take care not to break the natural protective

skin or outer layer of the specimen. Stems should be left on all vegetables except tomatoes and muskmelons. The stem helps keep the vegetables from drying out.

Cleaning Tips

Dirt detracts from the appearance of vegetables but it is not advisable to wash all vegetables to clean them. Tender-skinned vegetables such as peas, beans, summer squash, peppers, tomatoes, and eggplant should be wiped clean with a soft cloth. If necessary to wash root crops, soak in cool water and gently wash with soft cloth; do not scrub. Leafy crops such as cabbage, lettuce, spinach and swiss chard can be washed carefully. A soft bristled brush can be used to clean cauliflower, kohlrabi, cucumbers and onions of any soil.

Preparing the Vegetable Specimen for Show

BEANS NAP: Harvest before seeds appear, when the seeds are about half grown. The ends of the pods should not be broken. The entire stem should be left on. Avoid showing blemished or wilted specimens.

BEETS, CARROTS, PARSNIPS, TURNIPS, RUTABAGAS: Tops should be trimmed off 1-1/2" to 2" above the crown. Trim side roots, Trim tap root of beet and turnip 1", carrots 1", parsnip 1/2" and rutabagas 1".

LIMA BEANS: Seeds should be full grown but still tender and before they have changed from green to white. Prepare like snap bean.

BROCCOLI: Heads should be dark green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems should be cut 5" - 6" from the top if the head.

CABBAGE: Select firm, compact heads. Stems should be cut 1/4" below the head. Leave 2 to 3 outside wrapper leaves.

CAULIFLOWER: Heads should be white, compact and not ricey. Stems should be cut to leave 4 to 6 leaves. Trim leaves to 1" - 2" above the white head.

SWEET CORN: Select ears well filled out to the tip. Kernels should be milky. Leave 2 banner leaves on husks. Trim silks to 1". Trim shank to 1".

CUCUMBERS: For pickling select fruit 3" - 5" long. For slicers Select fruits straight, dark green, 6"-10" long. Leave 1/4" stem.

EGGPLANT: Trim stems to 1-1/2" to 2". Calyx should be green. Avoid large fruits.

KOHLRABI: Ball should be 2" - 3" diameter with root removed just below the ball. Trim back leaves on upper one-third of ball to 4" - 6". Remove all other leaves.

MUSKMELON: Harvest fruits when they separate easily from the vine. Specimens should be free of spots and injuries.

ONIONS: Have specimens mature and cured. Do not peel - remove only outer scales that are broken or discolored. Trim roots for 1/2". Trim dried, twisted tops to 1"-2".

PEAS: Select bright green, well-filled pods. Do not wash the bloom. Leave stems as beans.

PEPPERS: Select specimens that are uniform in size, shape and color. Trim stems to 1/2" - 1". All specimens should have the same number of bottom lobes.

POTATOES: Tubers should be uniform in size and shape. Washing is permitted but do not scrub. Avoid defects or disease.

PUMPKIN: Specimens should be mature. Trim stems to 2". Wipe clean.

SUMMER SQUASH: Select small to medium fruit. Leave stem 1/2". Zucchini, straight-neck and crookneck should be 6" - 8" long. Round scallop type should be 2" - 3" diameter.

WINTER SQUASH: Select specimens where the rind resists the pressure of the thumbnail. Trim stem to 2" - 3".

SWISS CHARD: Select plants that are fresh, crisp, and bright green. Trim off roots and trim buts to pyramid shape.

TOMATOES: Remove stems. Fruits should be perfectly shaped and free of cracks or blemishes. Show with the stem scar down.

WATERMELON: Fruits should be mature but not overripe. Leave 1" stem. Wipe clean.
